1.80-20 NW Ohio Chapter and its Mission

The 80-20 Northwest Ohio Chapter was founded in the beginning of 2009. The mission of this organization is the same as that of its parent (national) organization. 80-20 Initiative (http://www.80-20initiative.net/), which is to win equal justice and opportunity for all Asian Pacific Americans (APAs). In addition, 80-20 NW OHIO engages in political action at the State and local levels, seeking to remove any political and institutional barriers that prevent APAs in Northwest Ohio from receiving and enjoying the full justice and equality to which all Americans are entitled (see the by-laws of the chapter http://www.80-20initiative.net/about/chapters oh bylaws .pdf)

2. Chapter Board, Officers, and Community Leaders

According to the by-laws, the chapter has four board directors plus the chapter president (Drs. Gene Chang, Joe Chao, Guang-zhong Chen, Kit Chan, and Yueh-Ting Lee as President).

3. Forum on Asian American Immigration and Equal Justice

On April 11, our forum had three distinguished speakers: Larry Y. Chan, Associate General Counsel, Bowling Green State University; Dr. Morris Jenkins, Associate Professor, The University of Toledo; Fan Zhang, Esq., The Law Firm of Wagoner & Steinberg, Ltd. 4. Engaging Five Mayoral Candidates in Toledo, OH

Since March 2009, our chapter board directors, officers and community leaders have engaged five mayoral candidates—Keith Wilkowski (D). Ben Konop (D), Jim Moody (R), Mike Bell (I), and D. Mike Collins (I), for discussion on issues of interest to our community. A written copy of the questionnaire was sent to each of them. Here are some of the sample yes/no questions:

"If you are elected to be a Toledo mayor, will you enhance and promote Asian American cultural programs within 18 months? If elected, will you appoint at least ONE Asian American on your strategic or think-tank team? If elected, will you hire Asian Americans who will directly report to you or consider giving fair contract bids to Asian American businesses? If elected, will you promote Asian American employees to the administrative or managerial levels proportionately similar to white women and other minorities? If elected, will you take specific actions to protect Asian American equal justice and rights (including fighting against discrimination or racism against Asian Americans)?"

All of the five candidates replied with their answers. Based on their answers, we will continue to engage them in further discussion.
